<p>Set-up & Break-down of Layout</p> <p>Transmission of virus through close contact with infected person, or by touching items handled by an infected person.</p> <p>Risk lowered due to open-air nature of activity.</p>	Set-up Team	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Nobody to come to the shoot ground if they are displaying COVID symptoms or have been in close contact with anyone displaying symptoms, e.g. within their household, in past 14 days. ▪ 2m distance to be maintained where possible to do so. ▪ Where 2m distance cannot be maintained, e.g. putting traps back into container or handling large traps, those handling the traps will be positioned side by side and in close proximity for short period of time only. ▪ Only one person in a container at any time unless operationally necessary, e.g. for pulling traps in as laid out above. Container doors remain fully open to ensure good ventilation. ▪ Hand-sanitiser available and to be used frequently. Sanitising wipes to be used regularly on frequently touched surfaces. ▪ Set up team to be allocated a radio each which will be retained by that person until the end of the shoot. If passed to another person radio will be wiped down. 	Low	
	Set-up Team members in Clinically Vulnerable Category	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Set up team members in clinically vulnerable category, e.g. due to age or existing health conditions, should avoid any activity where 2m distancing cannot be maintained. All assistance is offered voluntarily, however, the club maintains a responsibility to ensure that anyone in this category is not put at risk. ▪ Vaccination roll-out expected to reduce risk to individuals who are in clinically vulnerable categories. <p>Shoot Activities</p> <p>Transmission of virus through close contact with infected person, or by touching items handled by an infected person.</p> <p>Risk lowered due to open-air nature of activity.</p>	All Shooters	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ All shooting arranged within UK Government guidelines current at time of shoot. CPSA guidance also followed as to specific requirements. ▪ Rules in place and emailed to members; verbal briefings will also be given on arrival. ▪ Members only permitted to shoot; member's guests can shoot if booked in advance. With current membership levels it is expected that the total number of shooters will allow for small groups of 4-6 people. ▪ Small group numbers will be arranged, 4 where possible to do so, but up to 6 permitted; anyone waiting to shoot must stay well back from the stand area until previous shooters are clear. ▪ Hand sanitiser available around the ground – at each stand. ▪ All payments to be made by card only, no cash. Payment desk to be set up outside weather permitting and payments made maintaining 2m distance. ▪ Nobody permitted to gather in groups; 2m distance to be maintained whilst waiting to book in. 	Low	
	Shooters in Clinically Vulnerable Category	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Reminders issued stating that anyone in a clinically vulnerable category (due to age or existing medical conditions) should use their own judgement at all times as to whether they think the controls are adequate to maintain their safety. 	Medium	
Refreshments	All	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Hot water urn and supplies will be cleaned down regularly through the shoot. ▪ Hand sanitiser & wipes provided on table. ▪ Signs displayed asking for people to sanitise their hands before and after making drinks. ▪ Disposable cups used. ▪ Any food available will be individually wrapped. 	Low
